

## TRAVELLING BY AIR

### SOUTHAMPTON AIRPORT

Wide Lane, SO18 2NL, 0844 481 7777  
Phone for flight and travel information, left luggage and car rentals.

Baggage can be left for £6 per day, some restrictions apply. For full details visit the Servisair desk in main terminal.

Mitchell's Kitchen & Bar, Costa Coffee, and WHSmiths are available at the airport before and after security.

Moneycorp provide a currency service to collect at the airport. For currency within 24 hours call 0845 621 0210.

Trains to Southampton Central are available every 15 minutes from Southampton Parkway, 1 minute walk from airport. Journey takes 8 minutes, £3.50 one way.

Taxis to the city centre and cruise terminals take 15-20 minutes, costing approximately £16-£20.

Passengers travelling to the Eastern Docks can take the U1C bus direct to Ocean and QEII.

## TRAVELLING BY TRAIN

### SOUTHAMPTON CENTRAL STATION

For national and local services. A free bus leaves from outside Platform 4 to Town Quay. There are no direct bus services to or from the cruise terminals. Taxis are available outside the main entrance or bookable through West Quay Cars.

## TRAVELLING BY BUS/COACH

Buses run from the city centre to all major destinations.

Destinations are clearly marked on the front of the bus and at the bus stop.

A free City-Link bus service runs between the Central Station, WestQuay Shopping Centre and Town Quay.

## NATIONAL EXPRESS COACH STATION

As well as the coach station, there are a number of coach drop-off points near West Quay Shopping Centre. There are no city bus services direct to the cruise terminal, taxis are available outside or bookable through West Quay Cars.

## SHORT TERM PARKING

Short term parking is available through Pay and Display car parks located directly opposite each of the cruise terminal buildings.

You can purchase additional time (if required) at the payment machines or by phone on 0330 400 7275.

Parking tariffs apply 24 hours a day, 7 days a week with a maximum stay of 24 hours. Please note there is a £100 parking charge applicable to anyone failing to comply with regulations.

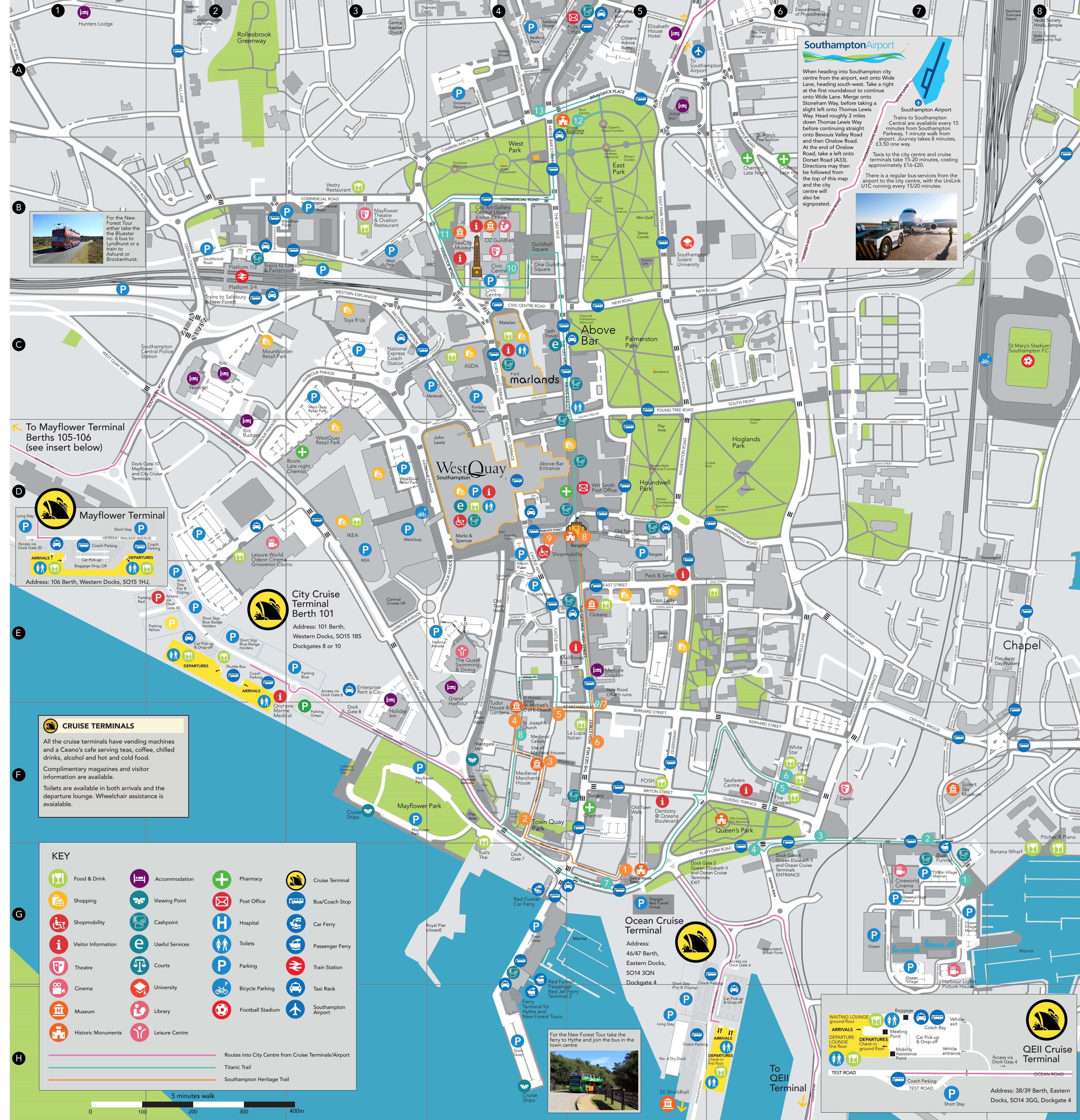

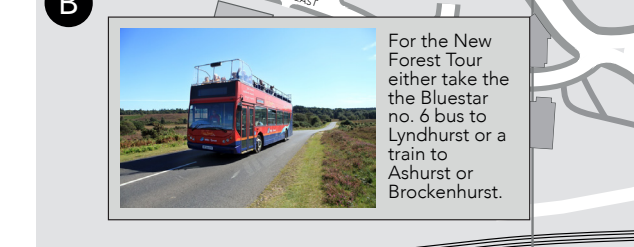
## Southampton Airport

When heading into Southampton city centre from the airport, exit onto Wide Lane, heading south-west. Take a right at the first roundabout to continue onto Wide Lane. Merge onto Stoneham Way. Before taking a slight left onto Thomas Lewis Way. Head roughly 2 miles down Thomas Lewis Way before continuing straight onto Bevoys Valley Road and then Onslow Road. At the end of Onslow Road, take a left onto Dorset Road (A33). Directions may then be followed from the top of this map and the city centre will also be signposted.

Trains to Southampton Central are available every 15 minutes from Southampton Parkway. 1 minute walk from airport. Journey takes 8 minutes, £3.50 one way.

Taxis to the city centre and cruise terminals take 15-20 minutes, costing approximately £16-£20.

There is a regular bus services from the airport to the city centre, with the UniLink UTC running every 15/20 minutes.



For the New Forest Tour either take the Bluestar no. 6 bus to Lymington or a train to Ashurst or Brockenhurst.

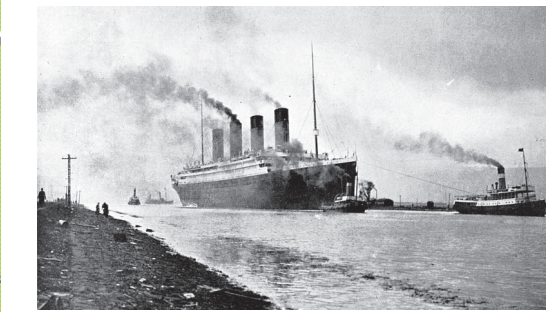

## WALKING ITINERARIES

Please note: these trails can be started from any point. They are not circular.

### TITANIC TRAIL



### 1 OCEAN VILLAGE

In 1912 this section of the port was the main dockyard, where tug boats would have pulled the Titanic out to sea.

### 2 CANUTE CHAMBERS

These were the local offices of the White Star Line, operator of the Titanic. As news of the disaster hit, anxious friends and relatives flooded the street. Names of the survivors were posted on large black boards outside of the offices. Of the 2,223 passengers and crew onboard, 706 survived. A plaque commemorating the disaster can be found on the gate pillar.

### 3 SOUTH WESTERN HOUSE



Originally a grand hotel, built in 1872. Ship designer, Thomas Andrews, and J Bruce Ismay, owner of White Star Line, both stayed here. Check-in for the ship took place within the hotel. A train then took passengers directly to the docks through Terminus station, at the rear of the building.

### 4 ADMIRALTY HOUSE

Back in the 1920's, this served as the post and telegraph office to the dock.

### 5 THE GRAPES PUBLIC HOUSE

Popular with engine room workers of the day. A framed blueprint of the Titanic, along with original photos can be seen here.

### 6 THE WHITE STAR TAVERN

Formerly known as The Alliance Hotel, many second and third class passengers stayed here. It is now a restaurant and boutique hotel.

### 7 THE PLATFORM TAVERN

Offering great views of the Titanic while she was moored, crew and passengers stopped here before boarding.

### 8 ST JOSEPH'S CHURCH

A memorial dedicated to the staff of the Ritz, one of the restaurants onboard, can be found here.

### 9 HOLYROOD CHURCH

Built in 1320, destroyed during the blitz in 1940, it now stands as a memorial for Southampton's merchant seamen. The Titanic Memorial Fountain, dedicated to the firemen, stewards and crew, can be found in the grounds.

### 10 THE CIVIC CENTRE

The Titanic was transporting almost 3,500 sacks of mail. Many postal workers died attempting to save an estimated 7 million pieces of mail. Here you will find The Titanic Postal Workers Memorial and Book of remembrance.

### 11 THE SEACITY MUSEUM

Opened 100 years to the minute after the Titanic set sail from Southampton. The museum provides a fascinating exhibition about the ship, her relationship with the city, as well as the city's relationship with the sea. A permanent exhibition dedicated to her can be found here. (See overleaf for more info)

### 12 THE ENGINEERS MEMORIAL



Erected in 1914, the memorial pays tribute to the men who kept the ship's power going during her final moments.

### 13 TITANIC MUSICIANS MEMORIAL

Unveiled in 1990 by survivors of the disaster, the memorial is dedicated to the musicians who continued to play their instruments on deck in an attempt to keep passengers calm.

### SOUTHAMPTON HERITAGE TRAIL



### 1 GOD'S HOUSE TOWER

Once home to the city's town gunner, the tower has seen a number of uses in its lifetime, including as a jail.

### 2 THE WOOL HOUSE



Built in the late 14th Century as a storehouse for wool waiting to be exported to Italy, it has been an important fixture of Southampton's waterfront for nearly 700 years.

### 3 MEDIEVAL MERCHANT HOUSE

The house has been restored to its original, 14th Century appearance. It contains a variety of replica period furniture.

### 4 TUDOR HOUSE AND GARDENS

15th Century timber framed museum in the heart of Old Town. The house and gardens have been recently restored. (See overleaf for more info)

### 5 SAINT MICHAEL'S CHURCH



The oldest building in Southampton, dating back to 1070.

### 6 THE RED LION

12th Century pub, and home of the 'Southampton Plot.' King Henry V and his troops were stationed in this building before they set sail for the Battle of Agincourt in 1415. It was here that a plot to kill the King and replace him with Edmund Mortimer, 5th Earl of March was foiled. The men were tried and found guilty of high treason and taken to the Bargate for execution.

### 7 HOLYROOD CHURCH



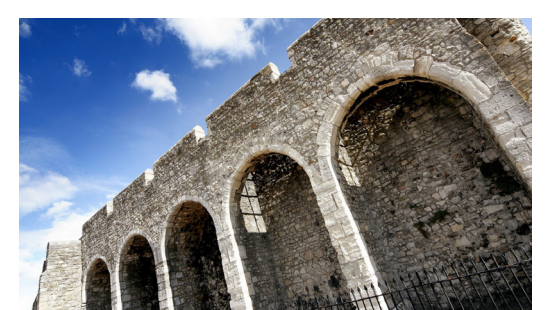
Just outside the church is the QE2 anchor, which was gifted to the city of Southampton by the Dubai Royal family and Cunard.

### 8 BARGATE



Constructed in 1180 by the Normans, the Bargate served as the main point of entry and exit to Southampton from the north. In its lifetime, the Bargate has fulfilled several functions as the city's guildhall, jail and police headquarters.

### 9 MEDIEVAL WALLS



The original borders of the city. Walk along the remains of historic towers, medieval stairs and through the heart of Old Town.

For the New Forest Tour take the ferry to Hythe and join the bus in the town centre.
